REMEMBERING MAYOR JOE CELANO

Joseph Anthony Celano, 96, a music-shop owner who, as mayor of Hatboro from 1981 to 2005, married more than 2,000 couples, died Tuesday, Oct. 30, at Luther Woods Nursing & Rehabilitation Center in Hatboro.

Mr. Celano operated the Music Store with his wife, Arlene. Both music lovers, they sold sheet music, records, cassettes, and then CDs, and briefly sold musical instruments, said their son, Tony. She played the French horn, and he was an opera aficionado, their son said.

Mr. Celano and his wife met while both served at Willow Grove Naval Air Base. They married in 1944. In 1945, they opened the music shop near the base, on York Road in Hatboro. Three years later, they moved from an apartment to a house in Hatboro. For 57 years, until the shop closed in 2002, he walked to work rain or shine, his son said. At first, he and his wife never took a vacation. When their son was able to mind the store, they enjoyed spending time at their summer home in Beach Haven, N.J.

Mayor Celano would often share stories about performing as many as six weddings a weekend. He said "I would steal a little here, I borrowed a little there, I add a little of my own." He would say "if they laugh at the jokes, I give them more jokes. If they say Amen after the prayers, I give them more prayers."

Mayor Celano would often comment about his own marriage, he always told people "I got lucky, I found a girl with a great sense of humor." Mrs. Celano passed away in 2008.

Mr. Celano, who was known as "Mayor Joe," served on the Hatboro Police Commission, chaired the board of the Hatboro YMCA, and was past president of the Montgomery County Mayors Association. In 1960, he was honored by the Hatboro Lions Club for heroism after he saved three young girls from a burning car on York Road.



Remembering Mayor Joe Celano *(continued from front page)*

As a distinguished Hatboro citizen, he rode in horse carriages or fire trucks or convertibles in Hatboro Christmas parades from 1981 to 2010. A native of New York City, Mr. Celano left home with a friend at 15 and went to work in a laundry on Cape Cod for 25 cents an hour. Later, he became a welder at the Fore River Shipyard in Quincy, Mass. During World War II, he was a chief petty officer and radio technician at a naval air station in Rhode Island. He was transferred to Willow Grove when he became part of a team installing radar on planes that could detect German submarines, his son said.

In addition to his son, Mr. Celano is survived by a daughter, Julie; four grandchildren; and two great-grandsons. Another daughter, Angela Wilson, died in 2006.



Mayor Joe was laid to rest with military honors in the Hatboro Cemetery. He will always be a part of Hatboro.

COUNCIL MEETING HAPPENINGS

In the last newsletter you were introduced to the three new members of Borough Council and read how all of Borough Council was committed to working together for our community.

At the October Council Meeting Borough Council honored four members of the Enterprise Fire Company for their years of service; Past Chief Mike Aiman – over 70 years, Past Chief Bill Gottshall - over 50 years, Joseph Lutz – 50 years and Joseph Reading – 50 years. Borough Council, the Mayor and citizens of Hatboro are very proud of these members for this accomplishment and thank all our volunteers for their dedication and hard work.

Also at the October Council meeting, representatives from the Bucks County Water & Sewer Authority asked Council for a waiver of the noise ordinance to permit installation of piping along County Line Road during the overnight hours. While Borough Council denied the application to work overnight, the contractor will be working during the day time hours. The Contractor has provided a list of intersections that will be closed and the projected dates of these closures.

- County Line & York RdDecember 11th-14th, 2012
- County Line & Jacksonville Rd.....February 5th – 8th, 2013
- County Line & Madison Ave....December 19th – 21st, 2012
- County Line & Warminster Rd.....March 4th – 6th, 2013

These are projected dates; detours will be posted prior to the closure.

Staff has been meeting with residents in the Hometown Streets neighborhoods to explain the project; the Borough was awarded a Hometown Streets Federal Grant for the improvements to provide safe pedestrian routes in the business and residential districts. The purpose of these meetings was for staff to explain the curb, sidewalk, grading, driveway adjustments and curb ramps that may impact individual properties. The project schedule for the remainder of 2012 includes meeting with property owners to explain the right-of-way and easement process, and continuing with legal and design work. Project construction would take place in 2013.

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is currently investigating Vapor Intrusion at the Raymark Superfund Site located at 220 Jacksonville Road. Borough Council made a promise earlier this year to make sure the EPA provides the Borough and residents in the area of this site with timely and accurate information about their work. The latest contact with the EPA has resulted in properties identified to be tested; these properties include residential and commercial buildings. The EPA is working with those property owners to request permission to test. The EPA has indicated that if a property owner has not been contacted by the EPA, your property does not need to be tested at this time. TANNER PARK PLAYGROUND

Tanner Park Tot Playground on Jefferson Avenue, Hatboro is alive and well.

Thanks to the Hatboro Public Works Department the basketball court has been completely reworked. The court has been re-stripped, all the basketball poles and backboards have been straightened and painted, and new goals and new nets have been installed.

The baseball backstop has been removed, and will be relocated, to make way for the installation of 10 new pieces of playground equipment for the 2-5 year olds and 5-12 year olds. All are handicap accessible. This new equipment has been selected from the most current styles of playground equipment available, and different from most that can be seen in the area. Playground hours will be the as at all other Borough parks - Dawn to Dusk.

The tot baseball field will be moved farther up the field and downsized for the use of the younger children. A new backstop will be installed at this new location so parents can still play pitch and catch with sons and daughter.

Picnic tables, which are wheel chair accessible, and benches will be available for resting while at the playground. Adults will also have access to a paved walkway through the park for exercising. This walkway will ramble around the park area landscaped with trees, shrubs, bushes and flowers.

Three new lights will be installed along the Memorial Walkway and offer secure lighting during the evening hours at dusk. No residential properties will be impacted. A sample of these Borough approved lights can be seen in front of the Hatboro Lofts along Jacksonville Road.



Since we are so late in the season, it is our hope to get the playground equipment installed before winter and to follow up with as much as described and as weather permits. A Grand Opening will likely take place next spring, if not sooner.

As Tanner Park is Borough Property, it was necessary for Elm Street Hatboro to go through the legal process, the Land Development process, and get the approval from the Shade Tree commission. We are appreciative of the work done by Elm Street's Solicitor, the Borough's Solicitor, Engineers, Zoning & Code Officer, and the Acting Borough Manager. Their efforts have helped make this journey possible.

It cannot be left unsaid the debt of gratitude for all the support that has made Tanner Park Playground a reality. We are very thankful for the "Labor of Love" from the Hatboro Horsham Kiwanis Club over the past six years, a major grant from the Borough Authority to get us started, donations from the the Porters, the Shordays, the Ronald McDonald House, McDonalds of Hatboro, Designs in Stone, Days Inn Horsham, Penn Valley Church, the Hatboro Lions and Rotary, Village Players, Sullivan Scrap Metals and Hatboro Federal Savings. Thank you also to the many individuals for donations of custom engraved pavers along the Memorial Walkway. Most importantly, the deepest appreciation to the Elm Street Hatboro Board of Directors for whom without their unrelenting support and activity this project would never have come to fruition.

We are looking forward to creating and completing a Tot Playground that will be enjoyable for all the residents in the entire area.

REAL ESTATE TAX OFFICE NEWS



The Real Estate Tax Office handles all Borough, County and School District taxes, Borough refuse fees and Montgomery County Waste Generation fees. All 2012 Borough and County tax bills are in the penalty period until December 31, 2012.

The 2012/2013 Hatboro Horsham School Tax bills are now in the penalty period. As of November 1, 2012 a 10% penalty will be added to any unpaid bill. Please contact the Tax Office if you did not receive your bill or if you change your mailing address anytime during the year.

The 2012 Pennsylvania Property Tax Rebate forms are available at State Representative Tom Murt's office located at 19 S. York Rd, Hatboro. This year the filing date has been extended until the end of December. The Rebate program provides rebates on taxes up to \$650.00. To be eligible you must be 65 or older, a widow and widower 50 years or older, or an individual with disabilities who is 18 years or older.

Please Note! To be eligible, your total household income cannot exceed \$ 35,000.00 and \$15,000.00 for renters for the tax year in question. However, only 50 % of income from Social Security or Railroad Retirement benefits is counted as income.

Borough of Hatboro Business Privilege Tax Information

ANY PERSON OPERATING A BUSINESS IN THE BOROUGH IS REQUIRED TO REGISTER AND OBTAIN A LICENSE

Any activity carried on or exercised for gain or profit within the Borough of Hatboro, including, but not limited to, any occupation, trade, profession, vending, leasing, business, vocation or other commercial activity is subject to the Borough Business Privilege Tax. Returns are filed on a calendar year and are due by April 30th of each year.

Forms may be obtained from the administrative offices of the Borough of Hatboro located at 414 S. York Rd during regular business hours.

Any business displaying signs are required to have a permit and pay a \$15.00 sign fee per year for each sign located at their place of business each year.

MONARCH WAYSTATION WINS 2012 COMMUNITY GREENING AWARD




Hatboro's Monarch Butterfly Waystation was created in the spring of 2012. The 120 sq. ft. Waystation is located in Miller Field and sits adjacent to Miller Meadow and the Pennypack Creek. A variety of native nectar and milkweed plants provide the ideal environment for Monarch's to feed and lay their eggs.

The Waystation is registered with monarchwatch.org (Station #5587) and our Monarch Waystation sign is attached to the garden fencing.



In addition to the Gardeners of Crooked Billet funding, a \$100 grant from the Garden Club Federation of Pennsylvania Seeds of Service Initiative Program helped to pay for the fencing, framing and plants. Hatboro's Public Works Department arranged for the delivery of two truckloads of mulch, Hatboro Cemetery provided soil, and Boy Scout Troop 81 helped with turning the soil. Pennypack Ecological Restoration Trust donated native plants, and Kremp's Florest donated annuals for immediate color.

In its first year, we are delighted to have observed over a dozen Monarchs safely go through the egg to caterpillar to chrysalis to butterfly stages in our Waystation. In addition, many other butterflies and bees visit regularly.

The World Wildlife Federation's March 2012 report from Mexico shows that the number of Monarch butterflies wintering there has dropped by nearly a third since 2011. Deforestation, drought, and the use of pesticides have all contributed to the decline of this valuable (pollination) and treasured species.

The Gardeners of Crooked Billet have created a website for the Monarch Waystation, so everyone can read about and see the results of their efforts. It is currently under construction, but you can see some of the photos here: <http://greendawgy.com>

Hatboro Police Department



Now that it's autumn, winter won't be far behind. Our northeast winters can bring us extreme cold, snow, sleet, and worse yet freezing rain. During these conditions, motorists need to exercise caution when driving. These conditions can cause special problems for motorists.

With the approach of the winter season, motorists should assure that their automobiles are in proper working order. The following tips may help motorists.

- Make sure all systems, including the power train, lights, wipers, fluids, defrosters and tires are in a safe operating condition. Make sure your tires are properly inflated and are adequate for snow. Remember, Pennsylvania law permits studded snow tires only from November 1 until April 15 of each year.
- Carry an emergency kit in your car that should include a first aid kit, flashlight, batteries and a blanket. A cell phone is obviously useful in the event of an emergency.



- Above all...Drive Safely! Obey all traffic laws and regulations. Remember, braking distances are greater under wet, snowy, or icy conditions. Never exceed posted speed limits and always drive at a safe speed for existing conditions.

Pedestrians also encounter special circumstances during winter weather. Borough of Hatboro Ordinance #1005, Section 21-302 states:

"Every person in charge or control of any building or lot of land fronting or abutting on a paved sidewalk, fire hydrant, handicapped ramp, and/or curb cut whether as owner, tenant, occupant, lessee, or otherwise, shall remove and clear away or cause to be removed or cleared away, snow and/or ice from a path of at least 36 inches in width from so much of said sidewalk, fire hydrant, handicapped ramp, and/or curb cut as is in front of or abuts on said building or lot of land." These specified areas are to be cleared within 24 hours following the cessation of a storm.

A Message from the Office of Emergency Management . . .

The Borough of Hatboro has implemented an Emergency Warning System in the event a tornado warning is issued by the National Weather Service. The Borough began testing this warning system in September 2011. The test will consist of the sounding of the Borough Fire Siren for one minute the first Saturday of each month at 12:00 PM.



The siren sound will be different than the one you hear when there is a fire. In this civil defense mode, the siren emits a continuous tone for three minutes in the event of an actual tornado.



Your emergency may be in Montgomery County, but your call for help might cross the border.

WHEN YOU CALL 911



Tell them: "I'm calling from Montgomery County"

Montgomery County 9-1-1 needs your help in getting you help!

If you use a cell phone in one of our border communities, there's a good chance that your call may end up in Philadelphia or another neighboring county. And although the operator there will transfer the call back to Montgomery County, the amount of time it takes to figure out the location of the emergency could make a difference in saving someone's life.

When giving the location of your emergency, be sure to say: ***"I'm calling from Montgomery County"***. That should be enough for the operator to transfer your call. If they don't respond accordingly, say it again: ***"I'm calling from Montgomery County"***.

This only applies to calls made from cell phones within range of towers that exist outside Montgomery County. If you use a landline telephone, your call is automatically routed to the correct call center.

Hatboro's Storm Water Management Ordinance



As many residents and business owners of Hatboro are aware, the Borough is responsible for monitoring the Hatboro storm sewer system for pollutants and to remove or direct to have removed any identified sources of pollution. In the case of storm water, a pollutant is basically anything that is not rain water or snow melt. Common storm water pollutants are bacteria from pet waste, fertilizer from lawns, and sediment from overland runoff. Other sources of pollution are the improper use or disposal of motor oil, paint, anti-freeze and cleansers.

Hatboro's responsibilities regarding removal of pollution from storm water stems from legislation enacted by the Federal Government (Clean Water Act of 1972). The program that mandates Hatboro's responsibilities is the National Pollutant

Discharge Elimination System for Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (NPDES MS4 for short) and is administered by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). In Pennsylvania the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (PADEP) oversees all Pennsylvania municipalities as they work to comply with the NPDES requirements.

Hatboro, along with most other municipalities in Pennsylvania, is required to have an ordinance that regulates sources of storm water pollution and provides requirements for proper management of storm water runoff. Chapter 26 of the Borough of Hatboro Code of Ordinances contains the storm water management requirements that are required to meet the Federal requirements and to help keep storm water, and ultimately our streams, rivers, and oceans clean. Copies of the Borough Ordinance are available at Borough Hall for review.

Additional information can be found under the "FEMA & Stormwater" section of the Borough website (<http://www.hatborogov.com/stormwater.html>). This webpage contains valuable information regarding the NPDES program. Several links to EPA and PADEP websites as well as several educational resources are provided. All residents and businesses within the Borough are encouraged to review this information and to help in Borough efforts to keep our water clean.

CHRISTMAS TREE SAFETY

*As you deck the halls this holiday season, be fire smart.
A small fire that spreads to a Christmas tree can grow large very quickly.*

PICKING THE TREE

- Choose a tree with fresh, green needles that do you fall off when touched.

PLACING THE TREE

- Before placing the tree in the stand, cut 1-2" from the base of the trunk.
- Make sure the tree is at least three feet away from any heat source, like fireplaces, radiators, candles, heat vents or lights.
- Make sure the tree is no blocking an exit.
- Add water to the tree stand. Be sure to add water daily.



FACTS



One of every three home Christmas tree fires are caused by electrical problems.



Although Christmas tree fires are not common, when they do occur, they have a higher chance to be deadly.



A heat source too close to the tree causes one in every five of the fires.

LIGHTING THE TREE

- Use lights that have the label of an independent testing laboratory. Some lights are only for indoor or outdoor use.
- Replace any string of lights with worn or broken cords or loose bulb connections. Connect no more than three strands of mini string sets and a maximum of 50 bulbs for screw-in bulbs. Read manufacturer's instructions for number of LED strands to connect.
- Never use lit candles to decorate the tree.
- Always turn off Christmas tree lights before leaving home or going to bed.

AFTER CHRISTMAS

Get rid of the tree after Christmas or when it is dry. Dried-out trees are a fire danger and should not be left in the home or garage, or placed outside against the home. Bring outdoor electrical lights inside after the holidays to prevent hazards and make them last longer.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT UPDATE

Winter weather was kind to us last year as we only had one snow storm of any consequence, relieving the borough of the need to use the heavy equipment for snow removal from the borough roads. We can only hope for a repeat of that weather this year.

The early spring opened with our Public Works department having their annual duty of preparing the Hatboro Public Pool for another enjoyable season for our residents and guests. Upon examination it was clear that a new snack stand was needed at poolside. The Public Works employees were assigned the additional duty of remodeling and building a new snack stand. Many additional hours were spent working on the snack stand but it was ready for the opening of the pool. All went well at the pool during the year and on Labor Day the pool was closed until next spring.

The Public Works department is headquartered in a small facility on Oakdale Avenue. The department invests in large equipment such as trash trucks, recycling vehicles and snow plows that need space. As a result, the Public Works department is rapidly running out of room. Your borough council has hired a consulting firm to do a facilities study to see if changes can be made at the current locations to more efficiently use the space currently available, saving the borough time and money and at the same time improving working conditions in the buildings. The facilities study also includes the Borough Hall and the Police Station. We anxiously await the results of the study.

Borough council also plans to dedicate funds in next year's budget to continue the practice of road repaving.

Finally, borough management is always encouraging the residents and those working in the borough to do as much recycling as possible. I am happy to report that we are making great progress in that effort. I wish to thank all of you for taking the time to read this update and again thank the employees of the Hatboro Public Works department for their dedication to those who live and work in our town.

2013 WINTER SNOW GUIDE

SNOW & ICE REMOVAL

(Borough Code of Ordinances: 1005, Section 21-302)

Borough of Hatboro Ordinance requires the owner, occupant, or tenant of every property in the Borough to remove snow and ice from sidewalks 24 hours following the cessation of a storm. Compliance with Snow & Ice Removal is extremely important for pedestrians and emergency services. Please shovel your sidewalks!!!



PLOWING PROCEDURES



The Borough Public Works Department works tirelessly to restore roads to drivable condition following a snow storm. Plowing begins once snow accumulation reaches two inches in depth. During heavy snow storms, Borough crews must maintain access on the main roads continuously. The following roads will be plowed continuously to provide access to emergency vehicles:

- York Road
- Byberry Road
- Horsham Road
- Moreland Avenue
- Montgomery Avenue
- Jacksonville Road
- County Line Road
- Warminster Road

We ask residents to please be patient with our crews; we will make sure that we get to every street in the Borough.

The public works department is asking for residents to remove parked vehicles from the street during a snow event, parking in your driveway allows our crews to fully clear your street. If you live on a snow emergency route, if a snow emergency is declared you must remove your vehicle from the street or it will be towed.

SNOW SHOVELING TIP TO AVOID BEING PLOWED IN

While shoveling driveways, the Borough of Hatboro Public Works Department asks residents not to pile snow in the public roadways, rather place the removed snow to the left of your driveway when facing the house. This will keep residents from being plowed in when crews commence their activities. It is impossible to keep snow from being deposited in driveways and sidewalks. For safety and efficiency, plows cannot be lifted at driveways.

Also please remove all Basketball nets from the Right of Way. These are not permitted in the right of way and may be damaged during snow collection efforts; the Borough will not be responsible for any damages to basketball nets.

CARBON MONOXIDE POISONING

With winter fast approaching, residents need to be aware of carbon monoxide poisoning. Carbon monoxide poisoning occurs after enough inhalation of carbon monoxide (CO). Carbon monoxide is a toxic gas, but being colorless, odorless, tasteless, and initially non-irritating, it is very difficult for people to detect. It is often produced in domestic settings by incomplete combustion due to an insufficient supply of oxygen to enable complete combustion of the fuel in your heater. Symptoms of mild acute poisoning include lightheadedness, confusion, headaches, vertigo, and flu like effects; larger exposures can result in death.



In order to make your home safer for you and your family, please consider installing a carbon monoxide detector. CO detectors are designed to measure CO levels over time and sound an alarm before dangerous levels of CO accumulate in your home, giving people adequate warning to safely ventilate the area or evacuate.

The devices, which retail for \$15-\$60 are widely available and can be battery-operated or AC powered. All CO detectors have "test" buttons like smoke detectors. CO detectors can be placed near the ceiling or near the floor because CO is very close to the same density as air. It is a small price to pay to help provide an additional level of safety for you and your family.


