

A Message from Hatboro's
CHIEF OF POLICE



Naloxone, also known under the brand name Narcan, is a medication that can reverse an overdose caused by an opioid drug (i.e. certain prescription pain medications or heroin). Naloxone has been used by medical professionals to reverse

the effects of opioids on the brain and respiratory system in order to prevent death for more than forty years.

It's no secret that the U.S. is in the midst of an opioid addiction crisis that some have termed an "epidemic." In September 2015, in response to this situation, PA Act 139 of 2014 was signed into law by Governor Wolf. Among other things, this law authorized properly trained police officers to possess and administer Naloxone to victims of opioid overdoses.

The Montgomery County District Attorney's Office and Montgomery County Department of Public Safety has funded the procurement of Naloxone auto injectors with the intent to supply these life saving devices to any Montgomery County police department desiring to participate in the program. I am pleased to report that all Hatboro Police officers have successfully completed the required Naloxone training program and are now properly trained and authorized to administer Naloxone in the field. Recently, we received a supply of the auto injector kits and we have deployed them for field use.

As of January 2016, eighteen Montgomery County municipal police departments and the Montgomery County Adult Probation Department are participating in the Naloxone program. Several more police agencies have joined since January. According to the Montgomery County Department of Public Safety, there were 26 instances of field use of Naloxone that resulted in the survival of the overdose victims during 2015.

The Borough of Hatboro receives outstanding service from

the Second Alarmers Rescue Squad in terms of EMS services. The Second Alarmers have been using Naloxone for years and I have personally witnessed its dramatic lifesaving effects on overdose victims. The drug clearly saves lives. Often when we respond to drug overdose calls, police arrive prior to EMS. By carrying Naloxone in our police cars, we will be able to rapidly administer the drug which will result in lives saved.

I view the acquisition and deployment of Naloxone another tool in our arsenal to save lives and combat drug abuse. In addition to our drug law enforcement operations and participation in the District Attorney's Office Montgomery County Drug Task Force, the department has secured a prescription drug disposal box for the police station. This disposal box was made possible by funding from Montgomery County District Attorney Kevin Steel and the Pennsylvania District Attorney's Association. If you are not familiar with these boxes, they are similar to a secure mail drop box. The goal of the disposal program and organized prescription take back initiatives is to safely dispose of prescription drugs, including opioids, so they do not fall into the hands of abusers. The safe, legal disposal of medications also prevents these chemicals from contaminating our waterways and sanitation systems. The box is located in the lobby of our temporary headquarters on the second floor the Hatboro Municipal Building. We are open 24/7 and residents may stop by at any time to dispose of medications.

On October 19, 2015 Hatboro participated in a one-day drug take-back program at our police station with great success! On that day, over 34 pounds of expired or unused prescription drugs were dropped off at our station in just a four hour period.



A second initiative, held on April 30, 2016 resulted in 49 pounds of expired, unwanted, or unused medications being turned into the HPD!

Thank you to all residents who came out to safely dispose these drugs! Have a safe and healthy summer!

SUMMER TIPS - From Our Fire Marshal

As warm weather approaches, we all start to clean up from the long winter—making repairs around the house, enjoying the outdoors. Keeping a few safety tips in mind will help you make your family and home a little safer. As always we are available for questions at 215-443-9100.

Inside the Home:

- Check and clean your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors
- Check your fire extinguishers
- Prepare for storm related outages (make sure your flashlights and portable radios have batteries and that other supplies, such as bottled water, are ready and available)
- Properly store household chemicals and never mix cleaning agents

Outside and Around the Yard:

- Make sure your address numbers are up and visible from the street.
- Clean up yard debris. Cut back dead limbs as they easily fall during storms causing damage or injury.
- Clean your grill and be sure that it is free of grease buildup. Check all propane tanks and lines for leaks and damage.

In the Garage or Shed:

- Clean up and properly store paints, pool and yard chemicals.
- Check fuels containers for leaks and make sure they are properly stored.
- Have all power equipment cleaned, serviced and ready for safe use

Through funding provided by the Montgomery County District Attorney, Kevin Steele and the Pennsylvania District Attorney's Association, the Hatboro Police Department has obtained a secure prescription medication disposal box that is located at the new Police Headquarters in the Second Floor of Borough Hall. Citizens may utilize this disposal container to safely dispose of any expired, unused, or unwanted medications, no questions asked. Please do not place syringes, injectable drugs, aerosol dispensers or liquids containing hydrogen peroxide in the collection bin.

Things to Remember

as we approach
Independence Day and Veterans Day

In 2015, The Borough of Hatboro celebrated its 300th Birthday. Throughout last year, we had several events to commemorate that milestone.

For Veterans Day, there were events at three locations where we have standing Veterans Monuments: On the grounds of the Crooked Billet Elementary School, in the Cemetery of the Hatboro Baptist Church, and at the Hatboro Library.

Included here are words spoken by Robert Hegele, a Vietnam Veteran and Borough Councilman, at the Hatboro Baptist Church.

In 1988, this monument was placed here on the grounds of the Hatboro Baptist Church by American Legion Post 271 of Hatboro. The key speaker that dedication day was Vietnam War Congressional Medal of Honor Winner Colonel Joseph Marm. This cemetery, still used today, is a final resting place for Hatboro Veterans of the Civil War, WWI, and WW2. Buried here is Sgt. Barkley Stanger, an African-American from Hatboro who served throughout that 5 year civil war, also seeing action at Gettysburg.

What is so unique about this memorial and plaque is its all-inclusive wording: "To remember the men and women for service to their country in time of war, foreign and domestic: A monument to the services and sacrifices of all veterans, in all our wars." All wars to include WW1, WW2, and Korea. From the Revolutionary War, with the Battle of Crooked Billet fought right here in Hatboro—to the most recent wars in Iraq and Afghanistan. From our civil war, which divided and tore our nation apart—to Vietnam, a war that not only fractured a nation, but its returning troops as well.

Vietnam veterans, such as myself, returned to an ungrateful nation that vilified, scorned, and shunned its returning veterans for years. We were spit at, taunted, assaulted, labeled "Baby Killers," and other demeaning slogans repeatedly. For years, many of us wouldn't acknowledge our military service. To date, we still feel the effects of our treatment.

That is why we Vietnam-era vets, seeing what happened to us, would never let it happen again to our returning soldiers, sailors, airmen, marines, and coast guardsmen. We never want to see our troops feel the pain and the disrespect that we received, when they return home.

It warms our hearts to see how things really have changed—a grateful nation and its people. Although at times some may not support a war or conflict, they will still support and stand by the members of the armed forces. Service members who will become the veterans we know, love, and support. Yes, times have changed. Our troops now return home to open arms and a respectful, well earned, "welcome home, job well done."

Our veterans have all made sacrifices. When you see a vet, thank a vet. Do that, not only on Veterans Day, but throughout the year. Show your support and appreciation to that Veteran for helping maintain the freedoms we enjoy today because of their outstanding and patriotic service.

To the public, thank you for your support!

And to all Veterans, past, present, and future, thank you for your service and welcome home!

VACATION CHECKLIST

Vacations provide burglars with plenty of time to enter an unoccupied home and remove large items or search leisurely for hidden valuables. If you are planning a vacation, please take precautions to protect your home while you are away. It is important to create an illusion of everyday activity. Following this checklist will make it appear that someone is home, which is your first defense against burglary.

- Stop mail and newspaper deliveries or have a trusted neighbor collect them while you are away so that they do not accumulate. Also ask your neighbor to remove any advertising flyers that are deposited in your mailbox or around your door, driveway, or lawn.
- Secure all doors, windows, pet entrances, and garage doors.
- Transfer valuables to a safety deposit box or have a family member store them until you return.
- Place timers on indoor lamps and appliances to illuminate your home at night. Also consider setting timers to turn on radios and televisions randomly during the day.
- Keep some shades and blinds up or curtains open to maintain a normal appearance.




MOSQUITO PREVENTION TIPS

Mosquitos can lay up to 250 eggs at a time in still water and will hatch in 7 to 10 days. However, if you and your neighbors take steps to eliminate standing water from around your home, the mosquito population will be reduced dramatically. Consider the following tips to prevent mosquitoes from ruining your outdoor activities:

- Make sure your gutters and downspouts are clean and running properly, and adjust them as needed to provide proper drainage.
- Survey your property to see if anything stored outdoors might collect and hold water.
- Remove standing water in ponds, ditches, clogged rain gutters, flower pots, plant saucers, and puddles.
- Clean and rinse birdbaths at least once a week.

Toxic and flammable household chemicals are collected for proper disposal. **Acceptable items** include gasoline, oil, kerosene, turpentine, paint thinner, oil paint, stains, varnish, pool chemicals, herbicides, pesticides, antifreeze, caustic cleaners and solvents, mercury, thermometers, flares, fire extinguishers, lead acid batteries, rechargeable batteries, fluorescent tube light bulbs, CFL bulbs, mini propane canisters, and electric oil filled heaters. Containers returned upon request.

The maximum amount accepted is 25 gallons or 220 pounds. No 25- or 50-gallon drums.

Do Not Bring electronics, appliances, asbestos, explosives, ammunition, medical waste, radioactive waste, smoke detectors, items containing Freon, tires or the following:

- ⊗ **Latex or Water-Based Paint** is not hazardous and can be placed in the trash once it is dry. Air dry latex paint or add absorbent material like kitty litter until paint becomes a solid.
- ⊗ **Alkaline Household Batteries** are not hazardous and should be thrown in the trash.
- ⊗ **Prescription Medications** should be disposed of in the secure drop boxes located in many area police stations, a list of which can be found in the Recycling Guide at MontgomeryCountyRecycles.org.
- ⊗ **Propane Tanks** should be taken to locations listed in the Recycling Guide at MontgomeryCountyRecycles.org. Mini propane canisters are accepted at collections.

STORMWATER MANAGEMENT



As we prepare for warm Spring and Summer days ahead, it is important to keep stormwater runoff in mind. There are a few simple things everyone can do to minimize pollutants carried to our streams and rivers by stormwater runoff.



1. Consider using fertilizer with low nitrogen and phosphorus, and make sure to mix your fertilizer into the soil. This will reduce the amount of nutrient runoff that promotes harmful algae blooms in our waterways.
2. Keep grass clippings out of the street and storm sewer. These grass clippings can easily cause blockages in stormwater systems, and their decomposition releases excess nutrients into the waterways.
3. Consider installing a rain barrel to collect excess stormwater runoff and use it for future car washing or watering of plants.
4. It is important that you clean up after pets during walks as well as in your own back yard.
5. When performing maintenance of your vehicle, make sure that all oil and antifreeze waste is safely collected and disposed of at approved locations.

With everyone doing their part, our stormwater systems and waterways will look better than ever before!

BUSINESS PRIVILEGE TAX INFORMATION

Any Person Operating A Business in the Borough is Required to Register and Obtain a License

Any activity carried on or exercised for gain or profit within the Borough of Hatboro, including, but not limited to, any occupation, trade, profession, vending, leasing, business, vocation, or other commercial activity is subject to the Borough Business Privilege Tax. Returns are filed on a calendar year and are due by April 30th of each year.

Forms may be obtained from the administrative offices of the Borough of Hatboro located at 414 S. York Rd. during regular business hours.

Any business displaying signs are required to have a permit and pay a \$15.00 sign fee per year for each sign located at their place of business each year.



Information From

THE REAL ESTATE TAX OFFICE

The Real Estate Tax Office handles all Borough, County, and School District taxes, and Borough refuse fees. The 2016 Borough and County combined mills are 11.337. The 2016 Commercial Refuse Fee for all commercial properties is \$700.00 per unit. The Residential Refuse Fee is included with your taxes—unless you own a multi-family dwelling. The fee for Non-Owner Occupied Building is \$340.00 per unit.

All Borough and County Tax Bills were mailed February 1st. As of April 1, 2016 all Real Estate bills are charged the face amount of the taxes. After May 31, 2016, all Borough and County tax bills will be charged an additional 10% penalty.

The 2016-2017 Hatboro-Horsham School Tax bills will be mailed in early July.

All bills are mailed to the taxpayer. If the taxes are escrowed and paid by a mortgage company or bank, it is the responsibility

of the taxpayer to immediately forward the bill to the mortgage company or bank. Please check your mortgage statement to verify that your taxes were paid.

Any unpaid Real Estate Taxes will be turned over to the Montgomery County Tax Claim Bureau for collection in early January 2017. If taxes are turned over, the County will begin to add interest and costs to the homeowner's bill. If past due taxes are not paid within eighteen months the property is put up for Tax Sale.

Please contact the Tax Office if you did not receive your bill or if you change your mailing address anytime during the year.

A new feature has been added for your convenience. If the Tax Office is closed, there is a lockbox on the counter for you to deposit your payments. If you chose to use the box, a stamped receipt will be mailed to you.


