

**ORDINANCE NO. 1026
BOROUGH OF HATBORO
MONTGOMERY COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA**

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING PART 3, SECTION 15-304, OF THE
HATBORO BOROUGH CODE OF ORDINANCES, ENTITLED "TRUCK
TRAFFIC RESTRICTED ON CERTAIN STREETS", TO ADD AND
AMEND CERTAIN RESTRICTED STREETS AND TO LIMIT THE
EXCEPTIONS PROVIDED FOR TRUCK ACCESS**

WHEREAS, the Borough Code, 53 P.S. § 45101, et seq., authorizes the Borough Council of the Borough of Hatboro ("Borough Council") to make and adopt ordinances that are consistent with the constitution and laws of the Commonwealth when necessary for the proper management, care and control of the Borough and the maintenance of peace, good government, health and welfare of the Borough and its citizens;

WHEREAS, the Borough Council deems it be in the best interest and general welfare of the citizens and residents of the Borough to amend its Code of Ordinances, Part 3, Section 15-304, entitled "Truck Traffic Restricted on Certain Streets" to add and amend the enumerated streets and parts of streets whereby truck traffic is restricted, and to limit the exceptions for truck access for local deliveries and pickups.

WHEREAS, the Borough Council, after due consideration of the proposed ordinance at a duly advertised public hearing, has determined that the health, safety, and general welfare of the residents of Hatboro Borough will be served by the amendment of the Hatboro Borough Code of Ordinances.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Hatboro, Montgomery County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of same as follows:

SECTION 1. CODE AMENDMENT.

PART 3, SECTION 15-304, OF THE HATBORO BOROUGH CODE OF ORDINANCES, ENTITLED "TRUCK TRAFFIC RESTRICTED ON CERTAIN STREETS" IS HEREBY AMENDED AS FOLLOWS:

§ 15-304. Truck Traffic Restricted on Certain Streets.

1. It shall unlawful for any person to drive a motor vehicle other than a passenger car or a truck with class 1 registration on any of the following streets or parts of streets:

Penn Street, North	from East Montgomery Ave. to Meadowbrook Ave.

Springdale Avenue	from County Line Road to Summit Avenue
Summit Avenue	from North York Road to Bonaire Avenue
Tanner Avenue	from Springdale Avenue to Warminster Road
Terrace Avenue	entire length

Wood Street	from E. Monument Ave. to E. Montgomery Ave.

- Nothing in this Section shall prohibit any person from driving an emergency vehicle or a municipal, County, or State vehicle on any of those streets or parts of streets, or from driving on any of those streets or parts of streets a truck or other commercial vehicle making local deliveries to or pickups from premises located along that street or part of street when there is no alternative access to the premises through an unrestricted street or part of an unrestricted street.

SECTION 2. REPEALER.

All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith or in conflict with any of the specific terms enacted hereby, to the extent of said inconsistencies or conflicts, are hereby specifically repealed.

SECTION 3. REVISIONS.

The Council of the Borough of Hatboro does hereby reserve the right, from time to time, to adopt modifications of, supplements to, or amendments of its Ordinance, including this provision.

SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY.

In the event that any section, sentence, clause, phrase or word of this Ordinance shall be declared illegal, invalid or unconstitutional by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such declaration shall not prevent, preclude or otherwise foreclose enforcement of any of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately and be in force from and after its enactment as provided by law.

SECTION 6. FAILURE TO ENFORCE NOT A WAIVER.

The failure of the Borough of Hatboro to enforce any provision of this Ordinance shall not constitute a waiver by the Borough of its rights of future enforcement hereunder.

SECTION 7. ENACTMENT.

Under the authority conferred by the Borough Code, 53 P.S. § 45101, et seq., and other relevant statutory law, the Council of the Borough of Hatboro in the County of Montgomery, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania does hereby ordain and this Ordinance for the Borough of Hatboro, this 22nd day of June, 2015.


