

Chapter 15

Motor Vehicles and Traffic

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Part 1**General Regulations****§15-101. Definitions and Interpretation.**

1. The term “the Vehicle Code” when used in this Chapter shall mean the Vehicle Code of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, the Act of June 17, 1976, P.L. 162 No. 81, as amended.

2. The term “PennDOT” shall mean the Department of Transportation of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

3. The term “Chief of Police” and “Police Department” shall mean the duly appointed Chief of Police of the Borough of Hatboro and the Police Department of the Borough of Hatboro.

4. The term “Borough Council” shall mean the duly elected members of the Borough Council of the Borough of Hatboro, Montgomery County, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

5. The term “Borough” shall mean the Borough of Hatboro, Montgomery County, Pennsylvania.

6. Words and phrases, when used in this Chapter, except for sections or parts to which different or additional definitions apply, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in the Vehicle Code, except that, in this Chapter the word “street” may be used interchangeably with the word “highway,” and shall have the same meaning as the word “highway” as defined in the Vehicle Code.

7. The term “legal holidays” as used in this Chapter shall mean and include: New Year’s Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day.

8. In this Chapter, the singular shall include the plural, the plural shall include the singular, and the masculine shall include the feminine.

9. Although the streets in the Borough run generally in a northeast and southwest and a northwest-southeast direction, for the purpose of this Chapter, York Road and the streets running parallel or generally parallel to York Road shall be deemed to run in a north-south direction, and Moreland Avenue and the streets running parallel or generally parallel to Moreland Avenue shall be deemed to run in an east-west direction.

§15-102. Manner of Adopting Permanent Traffic and Parking Regulations.

All Borough traffic and parking regulations of a permanent nature shall be enacted as ordinances, as parts of ordinances, as amendments to ordinances, or as amendments to this Chapter, except where the law specifically authorizes less formal action; provided, however, that the regulations set forth in Parts 4, 5, 6, and 7 of this Chapter may be amended from time to time by resolution of Borough Council..

§15-103. Provisions to Be Continuation of Existing Regulations.

The provisions of this Chapter, so far as they are the same as those of ordinances and regulations in force immediately before the enactment of this Chapter, are intended as a continuation of those earlier ordinances and regulations, and not as new enactments. Nothing in this Chapter shall affect any act done or liability incurred, or any suit or prosecution pending or to be instituted under any of those repealed or superseded ordinances or regulations.

§15-104. Temporary and Emergency Regulations.

1. The Chief of Police shall have the following powers to regulate traffic and parking temporarily and in time of emergency:

A. In the case of fire, flood, storm, or other emergency, to establish temporary traffic and/or parking regulations.

B. In the case of emergency or to facilitate public works, or in the conduct of parades, processions, or public events, to restrict or prohibit traffic and/or parking in limited areas for periods of not more than 72 hours

2. Such temporary and emergency regulations shall be enforced by the Police Department in the same manner as permanent regulations. Any person who shall operate or park a motor vehicle, or who shall move, remove, destroy, injure, or deface any sign or marking erected, posted, or made to give notice of any such regulation, shall be in violation of this Part.

§15-105. Experimental Regulations.

The Borough Council may, from time to time by resolution, designate places upon and along the highways in the Borough where, for a period of not more than 90 days, specific traffic and/or parking regulations, prohibitions, and restrictions shall be in force and effect, and shall designate such locations by proper signs and markings. Such regulations, prohibitions, and restrictions shall be effective as if they had been specified in this Chapter. No person shall operate a motor vehicle, and no person shall move, remove, destroy, or deface any sign or marking erected, posted, or made by authority of this Section. The purpose of this Section is to allow for the test and experimental determination of the feasibility and desirability of permanent changes in the ordinances of the Borough of Hatboro relative to traffic and parking.

§15-106. Traffic on Streets Closed or Restricted for Construction, Maintenance or Special Events.

1. The Chief of Police shall have authority to close any street or specific part of a street to vehicular traffic and to place barriers or station police officers at each end of the closed portion, while construction or maintenance work is under way or a special event is being conducted on the closed portion. It shall be unlawful for any person to operate a motor vehicle upon any such closed portion.

2. The Chief of Police shall have authority to establish a restricted traffic area

upon any street where construction or maintenance work is under way and to station flagmen at each end of the restricted portion. It shall be unlawful for any person to operate a motor vehicle upon any such restricted traffic area at any time when the flagman is displaying a sign directing that vehicle to stop, or is signaling that vehicle, by a flag or other device, not to proceed.

§15-107. Use of Streets by Parades/Processions and Assemblages.

1. For the purpose of this Section, the words “assemblage” and “parade/procession” shall have the following meanings:

Assemblage—a gathering of people without vehicles, which interferes with the movement of pedestrian or vehicular traffic on any street.

Parade/procession—a group of individuals, vehicles, animals, and/or objects moving along a street in a way that interferes with the normal movement of traffic. A procession shall not include a funeral caravan or military convoy.

2. It shall be unlawful for any person to hold or participate in any assemblage unless the person organizing or conducting the assemblage first obtains a permit from the Chief of Police. Application for the permit shall be made at least 1 week in advance of the day on which the assemblage is proposed to be held, but in any case where a State-designated highway is proposed to be used, application shall be made at least 3 weeks in advance of the proposed date. The permit shall state the place where and the date when the assemblage is to be held, the hour when the assemblage may convene and the hour by which it shall have been completely dispersed. It shall be unlawful for any person to hold or to participate in any assemblage unless the permit has been granted, or at any time or place other than that authorized by the permit. A fee for the permit shall be set from time to time by resolution of Borough Council.

3. It shall be unlawful for any person to hold or participate in any parade/procession unless the person organizing or conducting the procession first obtains a permit from the Chief of Police. Application for the permit shall be made at least 2 weeks in advance of the day when the procession is proposed to be held, but in any case where the State-designated highway is proposed to be used, application shall be made at least 3 weeks in advance of the proposed date. The permit shall specify the date on which the procession is to be held, the route to be followed by the procession, the hour when and place where participants may commence to assemble and form before the procession is under way, the time when the procession may commence to move along its route, and the time by which the end of the procession shall have been disbanded. It shall be unlawful for any person to hold or to participate in any procession unless the permit shall have been granted, or under any conditions as to time or route or otherwise than those stated in the permit. A fee for the permit shall be set from time to time by resolution of Borough Council.

§15-108. Authority of Police Officers.

The police officers of the Borough are hereby authorized to direct traffic on the highways of the Borough and at intersections thereof and to otherwise enforce the provisions of this Chapter. Fire Police and special officers are hereby authorized to

direct traffic in the Borough.

§15-109. Authorization for Use of Speed Timing Devices.

1. The Police Department is hereby authorized to use all speed timing devices for the determination of speed of a motor vehicle as are approved or will be approved by PennDOT, in accordance with Title 75, Pa. C.S.A. §3368.

2. This Section authorizes the use of said devices upon all highways within the Borough be they Borough, County, or State highways, and does also hereby elect to exercise all powers granted to “local authorities” under the Vehicle Code as set forth in 75 Pa.C.S.A. §6101 *et seq.*, (1977), as hereafter amended, supplemented, modified, or reenacted by the General Assembly of Pennsylvania.

§15-110. Violations and Penalties.

1. Except for parking violations, when the same conduct is proscribed under the Vehicle Code (75 Pa.C.S.A.) and an ordinance of the Borough of Hatboro, the charge shall be brought under the Vehicle Code and not under the ordinance of the Borough of Hatboro. Prosecutions brought under any ordinance of the Borough of Hatboro which are based on a violation for which there is a specific penalty provided in the Vehicle Code, except for parking violations, shall be deemed as having been brought under the Vehicle Code and the assessment and disposition of the fines and forfeitures shall be so governed.

2. When a violation of this Chapter occurs, except for a parking violation, and said violation is not a violation of the Vehicle Code, the prosecution shall be brought under the appropriate section of this Chapter, and upon conviction thereof, the violator shall be guilty of a summary offense and may be sentenced to pay a fine not to exceed \$600 and/or undergo imprisonment not to exceed 90 days.

3. Each and every day that a violation of any section of this Chapter remains uncorrected, each violation constitutes a new and separate offense.

Part 2**Traffic Regulations****§15-201. Street Names and Maximum Speed Limits Established on Certain Streets.**

The official street names of all public streets in the Borough and the maximum speed limits are established on streets and on portions of specified streets, as follows, and it shall be unlawful for any person to drive a motor vehicle, on any part of a street where a maximum speed limit applies, at a higher speed than the maximum prescribed for that part of the street:

§15-202. Maximum Speed Limits Established on Certain Bridges and Elevated Structures.

Maximum speed limits are established, as follows, on certain bridges and elevated structures, and it shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle on any such bridge or elevated structure, at a higher speed than the maximum prescribed for that bridge or elevated structure:

§15-203. School Zones and Maximum Speed Limits Established.

1. No person shall drive a vehicle at a speed greater than 15 miles per hour in a school zone during the hours indicated below when school is in session and when the flashing lights are operating.

2. The following are declared to be school zones as defined by PennDOT regulations. Official traffic control devices with flashing lights shall be erected to

indicate the beginning and end of each school zone to traffic approaching in each direction:

§15-204. Maximum Speed Limits Established in Parks.

A speed limit of 15 miles per hour is established on all streets and roadways in the public parks maintained and operated by the Borough, except in the following locations, where the lower maximums, as specified, shall apply:

§15-206. Intersections Where Turn Prohibited on Red Signal.

§15-207. One-Way Streets Established.

§15-208. Turning at Certain Intersections Prohibited or Restricted.

It shall be unlawful for the driver of any motor vehicle, of the type indicated, traveling upon the first-named street at any of the following intersections, in the direction or directions indicated in each case, to make a left turn and/or a right turn into the second-named street, as indicated, at any time when such a turn is prohibited by this Section:

§15-209. Right Turns Only Permitted at Certain Intersections.

It shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle, traveling upon the first-named street at any of the following intersections, in the direction or directions indicated in each case, to make other than a right turn, at any time stated, both left turns and straight-across traffic being prohibited:

§15-210. U-turns Prohibited at Certain Locations.

It shall be unlawful for the driver of any motor vehicle, traveling upon any of the following portions of streets, in the direction or directions indicated for that street, to make a U-turn:

§15-211. No Passing Zones Established.

The following are established as no passing zones, and it shall be unlawful for the driver of any motor vehicle to overtake or pass another vehicle or to drive on the left side of the roadway in any no passing zone:

§15-212. Through Highways Established.

The following highways are established as through highways, thus authorizing stop or yield signs to be erected facing traffic approaching every intersection with the through highway except for those intersections with traffic signals, or with exceptions or modifications as indicated below. Every driver of a vehicle approaching a stop or yield sign authorized by this Section shall stop the vehicle or yield right-of-way as required by §§3323(b) or 3323(c) of the Vehicle Code, as the case may be, and shall not proceed into or across the through highway until he has followed all applicable requirements of that Section of the law:

§15-213. Stop Intersections Established.

The following intersections (in addition to intersections with the through highways established by §15-212) are established as stop intersections, and official stop signs shall be erected (or are ratified if previously erected) in such a position as to face traffic approaching the second-named street (the intersecting or through street) on the first-named street (the stop street) in the direction or directions indicated for that intersection. Every driver of a vehicle approaching the intersection on the first named or stop street, in the direction indicated in each case, shall stop the vehicle as required by §3323(b) of the Vehicle Code, and shall not proceed into or across the second-named or intersecting or through street until he has followed all applicable requirements of that Section of the law.

Each meter shall be placed or set so as to show that the parking space adjacent to that meter is or is not legally occupied. Each parking meter installed shall indicate by a proper legend the legal parking time established by the Borough, and when the adjacent space is occupied by a vehicle, the parking meter shall be capable of indicating on and by its dial and pointer the duration of the period of legal parking, and, on the expiration of that period, the meter shall indicate illegal parking or over-parking.

§15-504. Parked Vehicles to Be Wholly Within Marked Spaces.

Lines and/or markings shall be painted or placed upon the curb, sidewalk, or roadway adjacent to each parking meter for the purpose of delineating the parking space for which that meter shall be used. Every vehicle parked within the parking meter zone established in §15-501 of this Part shall be parked wholly within the lines or markings so placed and applicable to the adjacent meter. It shall be unlawful and a violation of this Part of any person to park a vehicle across any such line or marking, or to park a vehicle in such a position that the vehicle is not wholly within the area designated by those lines or markings.

§15-505. Coin Deposit in Meter Required; Overtime Parking Unlawful.

Whenever a vehicle is to be parked in any space adjacent to a parking meter, at any time in the period of limited parking as prescribed by §15-501 of this Part, the driver of the vehicle, upon entering the parking space, shall immediately deposit, or cause to be deposited, in that parking meter, for the occupied parking space, one or more proper coins of the United States of America as set forth in §15-501 of this Part, and indicated on the legend on the parking meter. Upon the deposit of the coin or coins, and placing the meter in operation, the parking space may be lawfully occupied by the vehicle for the time indicated on the meter, but not to exceed the maximum permitted time of 2 hours. If any vehicle shall remain in any parking space for any length of time after the meter shall indicate the time for lawful parking has expired, or for more than 2 hours, that vehicle shall be considered as having been parked overtime, and shall be in violation of this Part and the owner of the vehicle shall be subject to fines and penalties as set forth in §15-510 of this Part.

§15-506. Unlawful to Deposit Substitute for Coin in Meter.

It shall be unlawful for any person to deposit in any parking meter Installed under the provisions of this Part any slug or other substitute for a coin of the United States of America.

§15-507. Unlawful to Deposit Coin in Meter to Extend Parking Time Beyond Legal Limit.

It shall be unlawful and a violation of this Part for any person to deposit, or cause to be deposited, in any parking meter installed under the provisions of this Part any coin for the purpose of increasing or extending the parking time of any vehicle beyond the maximum legal parking time.

§15-508. Unlawful to Remain Parked at Meter Showing Violation.

It shall be unlawful, and a violation of this Part, for any person to permit a vehicle to remain in a parking space adjacent to a parking meter installed under this Part when that meter displays a signal indicating that the vehicle has already been parked there beyond the period of time prescribed for that parking space, or the time for which a coin or coins was deposited in that meter for the parking of that vehicle.

§15-509. Unlawful to Tamper with Meter.

It shall be unlawful, and a violation of this Part, for any person to deface, tamper with, open or willfully break, destroy, or impair the usefulness of any parking meter installed under the provisions of this Part. Provided; nothing in this Section shall apply to the servicing or opening of parking meters by officers, employees, or police officers of the Borough under the direction of the Chief of Police or Superintendent of Public Works.

§15-510. Violations and Penalties.

1. Any person who violates any section of this Part shall be issued a notice of violation (parking ticket) which shall be placed on or attached to the vehicle. The notice of violation shall include the following information:

A. A description of the violation of this Part for which the operator or owner of the vehicle is being cited.

B. The parking meter number.

C. The date and time that the notice of violation was issued.

D. The State license number on the vehicle.

E. Instructions to the owner or operator that if the owner or operator will report to the office of the Chief of Police and pay for the use of the Borough:

(1) For parking at expired meter, a fine in the amount which shall be set from time to time by resolution of Borough Council.

(2) For exceeding 3 hours parking at a meter, a fine in the amount which shall be set from time to time by resolution of Borough Council.

(3) For not being parked within the marked spaces, a fine in the amount which shall be set from time to time by resolution of Borough Council.

And if the said fine is paid within 5 days, that act will save the violator from the penalties prescribed in §15-510 of this Part.

2. Any vehicle owner or driver in violation of any section of this Part and who fails to report to the Chief of Police and pay the sum to the use of the Borough as instructed in subsection .1.E, shall be cited within 15 days of the violation, and upon conviction of stated violation shall be guilty of a summary offense and may be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$800 and/or undergo imprisonment for a term not to exceed 90 days. (*Ord. 948, 1/26/2004; as amended by Ord. 959, 6/27/2005*)

§15-511. Exceptions.

1. By resolution, the Borough Council may temporarily suspend the provisions of this Part which require coin deposit in meters and which establish a maximum parking time at meters.

2. The Borough shall have authority to establish no-parking or special-purpose parking zones within any parking meter zone, and to remove parking meters from those areas as previously installed there, and the provisions of this Part shall not apply in those areas.

§15-512. Amendments.

By resolution, the Borough Council may amend §15-501 to add, subtract or revise parking meter zones and may also amend the rates, hours of operation and maximum parking hours for parking meter zones.

§15-601. Metered Parking Lots Established.

The following are established as the metered parking lots established by this Borough:

§15-602. Placement and Characteristics of Parking Meters.

Parking meters installed in the parking lots shall be placed immediately adjacent to the individual parking spaces that shall be marked off and maintained in the lots. For each parking meter there shall be a clear indication, through use of a directional arrow, or an identification as to number with the parking space, to show which individual parking space it serves. Each parking meter shall indicate by a proper legend the parking rate and the maximum parking time established by §15-601 of this Part, and, when the parking space is occupied and the parking meter put into operation by the insertion of one or more coins, the parking meter shall indicate on and by its dial and pointer the duration of legal parking, and, upon the expiration of that period, shall indicate illegal parking or over-parking.

§15-603. Reserved Parking Spaces for Handicapped May Be Provided.

The Borough Council, at its discretion, may provide, at convenient and suitable locations in any one or more of the metered parking lots, reserved parking spaces for handicapped, and shall designate those spaces by appropriate signs. It shall be unlawful, and a violation of this Part, for any person to park in any such reserved parking space, any vehicle unless that vehicle bears or displays either: a “handicapped registration plate,” a “handicapped parking placard,” a “disabled veteran registration plate” or a “disabled veteran placard.”

§15-604. Parked Vehicles to Be Wholly Within Marked Spaces.

Lines and/or markings shall be painted or placed upon the surface of the metered parking lots, adjacent to each parking meter, for the purpose of delineating the parking space for which that meter shall be used. Every vehicle parked adjacent to any parking meter shall be parked wholly within the lines or markings so placed and applicable to that meter. It shall be unlawful and a violation of this Part for any person:

- A. To park a vehicle across any such line or marking.
- B. To park a vehicle in such a position that the vehicle shall not be within the

area so delineated by the lines or markings.

C. To park a vehicle elsewhere in any such lot that is an individual parking space adjacent to a parking meter.

§15-605. Manner of Parking at Meters.

It shall be unlawful for any person to park a vehicle in any metered parking lot.

A. Otherwise than with the front of the parked vehicle nearest to the parking meter applicable to that vehicle.

B. With any part of the vehicle touching the meter post or head or the raised base or barrier on which meters are erected.

§15-606. Coin Deposit in Meter; Overtime Parking Unlawful.

Whenever a vehicle is to be parked in any metered parking lot, at any time when the lot is open for use and the meters are to be in operation, the driver of the vehicle, upon entering the parking space, shall immediately deposit, or cause to be deposited, in the proper parking meter, one or more proper coins, of the United States of America as specified in the legend on the parking meter. Upon the deposit of the coin or coins, and placing the meter in operation, the parking space may be lawfully occupied by the vehicle for the time indicated on the meter. If any vehicle remains in any such parking space for such length of time that the meter indicates that the lawful parking time has expired, that vehicle shall be considered as being parked overtime, and the parking of a vehicle overtime shall be a violation of this Part. Provided: every hour that a vehicle remains parked at a meter showing a violation shall constitute a separate violation of this Part.

§15-607. Unlawful to Deposit Substitute for Coin in Meter.

It shall be unlawful for any person to deposit in any parking meter installed under the provisions of this Part any slug or other substitute for a coin of the United States of America.

§15-608. Unlawful to Remain Parked at a Meter Showing Violation.

It shall be unlawful, and a violation of this Part, for any person to permit a vehicle to remain in a parking space adjacent to a parking meter installed under this Part, when that meter displays a signal indicating that the vehicle has already been parked there beyond the period of time prescribed for that parking space, or the time for which a coin or coins was deposited in that meter for the parking of that vehicle.

§15-609. Unlawful to Tamper with Meter.

It shall be unlawful, and a violation of this Part, for any person to deface, tamper with, open or willfully break, destroy or impair the usefulness of any parking meter

installed under the provisions of this Part. Provided: nothing in this Section shall apply to the servicing or opening of parking meters by officers, employees or police officers of the Borough under the direction of the Chief of Police or Borough Council.

§15-610. Metered Parking Lots for Certain Types of Vehicles Only.

The metered parking lots established by this Part shall be for the use of passenger cars, passenger vans, and pickup trucks only, and it shall be unlawful for any person to park any other type of vehicle in any of those lots.

§15-611. Violations and Penalties.

1. Any person who violates any section of this Part shall be issued a notice of violation (parking ticket) which shall be placed on or attached to the vehicle. The notice of violation shall include the following information:

A. A description of the violation of this Part for which the operator or owner of the vehicle is being cited.

B. The parking lot name and meter number.

C. The date and time that the notice of violation was issued.

D. The State license number on the vehicle.

E. Instructions to the owner or operator that if the owner or operator will report to the office of the Chief of Police and pay, for the use of the Borough:

(1) For parking at expired meter, a fine in the amount which shall be set from time to time by resolution of Borough Council.

(2) For parking in a space reserved for handicapped without display of authorized handicapped parking permit, a fine in the amount which shall be set from time to time by resolution of Borough Council.

(3) For not being parked within the marked spaces, a fine in the amount which shall be set from time to time by resolution of Borough Council. And if the said fine is paid within 5 days, that act will save the violator from the penalties prescribed in subsection .2 of this Section.

2. Any vehicle owner or driver in violation of any section of this Part and who fails to report to the Chief of Police and pay the sum to the use of the Borough as instructed in subsection .1.E shall be cited within 15 days of the violation and, upon conviction of stated violation, shall be guilty, of a summary offense and may be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$600 and/or undergo imprisonment for a term not to exceed 90 days.

§15-701. Unmetered Parking Lots Established.

1. The following parking lots are established as the unmetered free parking lots operated by the Borough:

§15-702. Reserved Parking Spaces for Handicapped May Be Provided.

The Borough Council at its discretion, may provide, at convenient and suitable locations in one or more of the unmetered parking lots, reserved parking spaces for handicapped, and shall designate those spaces by appropriate signs. It shall be unlawful, and a violation of this Part, for any person to parking any such reserved parking space, any vehicle unless that vehicle bears or displays either: a “handicapped registration plate,” a “handicapped parking placard,” a “disabled veteran registration plate,” or a “disabled veteran placard.” Provided, all provisions, requirements, and restrictions contained in the other sections of this Part shall apply to vehicles lawfully parked in reserved parking spaces for handicapped.

§15-703. Unlawful to Park Overtime or When Lot Closed.

It shall be unlawful for any person to park a vehicle, or to allow a vehicle to remain parked in any unmetered parking lot:

- A. For longer than the maximum parking time prescribed by §15-701 of this Part.
- B. At any time when the lot is not in operation and is closed to public use.

§15-704. Unmetered Lots for Certain Types of Vehicles.

The unmetered parking lots established by §15-701 of this Part shall be for the use of passenger cars, passenger vans, and pickup trucks only, and it shall be unlawful for any person to park any other kind or class of vehicle in any such lot

§15-705. Manner of Parking.

Every vehicle parked in an unmetered parking lot shall be parked wholly within the lines bounding or marking the individual parking space assigned to that vehicle, and shall be parked headed into the parking space. It shall be unlawful for any person:

- A. To park a vehicle in a space not rented by him.
- B. To park a vehicle otherwise than as required by this Section.
- C. To park a vehicle elsewhere than in an individual parking space, the prohibited areas including, but not limited to, the access and exit driveways and turning and maneuvering spaces.

§15-706. Parking on Rental Basis Only.

Some parking spaces in the unmetered parking lots maybe available for parking on a monthly rental basis. The rental fee shall be fixed by Borough Council pursuant to a resolution and shall be for a calendar month or the part of a calendar month remaining after the rental arrangements are made. The rental fee shall be paid in advance to the Borough for the use of the Borough, and after the first month shall be automatically renewable until the renter notifies the Borough that he wishes to terminate the rental arrangements. The rental parking spaces shall be assigned by the Borough. The name of the renter of the parking space and/or the numbers and/or letters on the registration tag of the vehicle entitled to be parked there shall be recorded and reported to the Chief of Police. Spaces set aside for monthly rentals shall be numbered signs indicating "Parking by Permit only." It shall be unlawful for any person to park any unauthorized vehicle in a marked rental space.

§15-707. Violations and Penalties.

1. Any person who violates any section of this Part shall be issued a notice of violation (parking ticket) which shall be placed on or attached to the vehicle. The notice of violation shall include the following information:

- A. A description of the violation of this Part for which the operator or owner of the vehicle is being cited.
- B. The parking lot name and meter number.
- C. The date and time that the notice of violation was issued.
- D. The State license number on the vehicle.
- E. Instructions to the owner or operator that if the owner or operator will

report to the office of the Chief of Police and pay, for the use of the Borough:

(1) For parking at over permitted time limits—the sum of \$10.

(2) For parking in a space reserved for handicapped without display or authorized handicapped parking permit—the sum of \$25.

(3) For not being parked within the marked spaces—the sum of \$10 and if the said fine is paid within 5 days, that act will save the violator from the penalties prescribed in §15-707.2 of this Part.

2. Any vehicle owner or driver in violation of any section of this Part and who fails to report to the Chief of Police and pay the sum to the use of the Borough as instructed in subsection .1.E, shall be cited within 15 days of the violation and, upon conviction of stated violation, shall be guilty of a summary offense and maybe sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$600 and/or undergo imprisonment for a term not to exceed 90 days.

Part 8

Removal and Impoundment of Illegally Parked, Abandoned, or Disabled Vehicles

§15-801. Applicability and Scope.

This Part is enacted under authority of 75 Pa.C.S.A. §6109(a)(22) and gives authority to the Borough Police Department to remove and impound those vehicles which:

- A. Are parked in a tow away zone or otherwise in violation of parking regulations of this Chapter or the Vehicle Code.
- B. Have been abandoned (as defined by the Vehicle Code).
- C. Have been disabled due to damage or rendered inoperative as a result of wear and tear, mechanical failure or accident when they are parked in such a manner as to interfere with traffic or pose a hazard to others.

§15-802. Authority to Remove and Impound.

The Borough shall have authority to remove and impound, or to order the removal and impounding, of any vehicle parked overtime or otherwise illegally, provided that the circumstances of its parking were within the conditions stated in §15-801 of this Part. No such vehicle shall be removed or impounded except in strict adherence to the provisions of this Part, or the provisions of the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code.

§15-803. Tow Away Zones Designated.

The following designated streets and/or parking lots are hereby established as tow-away zones. Signs shall be posted to place the public on notice that their vehicles may be towed for violation of the Borough parking regulations:

§15-804. Designation of Approved Storage Garages; Bonding, Towing, and Storage.

1. The Borough Police Department shall prepare a “tow policy” in accordance with the provisions of this Chapter. The tow policy shall include the designation of an approved storage garage or garages, which have provided proof of 24 hour, 7 days a week availability, a secure storage area, sufficient appropriate equipment, proof of adequate liability, property damage and bodily injury insurance, and any other requirements deemed appropriate and necessary to provide adequate service, protect the interest of the Borough of Hatboro, police investigations and the property of the vehicle owner.

2. The Chief of Police shall issue a towing license to approved service providers. The license shall be issued upon application and the number of licenses shall be limited to a number deemed sufficient by the Chief of Police to insure sufficient towing coverage to meet the needs of the Borough. The licensed service provider must enter into a written agreement with the Police Department to provide service. The towing license shall be issued for a period of 1 year and may be renewed without re-application if the holder has performed the towing service in accordance with the original agreement or new revised agreement.

3. The annual agreement shall include a schedule of fees and related charges which will remain in effect until changed by mutual agreement of both parties.

4. The Chief of Police shall provide Borough Council with a list of licensed service providers and changes to that list as they occur.

§15-805. Payment of Towing and Storage Charges.

The payment of towing and storage charges shall not relieve the owner or driver of any vehicle from liability for any fine or penalty for the violation of the provision of this Part for which the vehicle was removed or impounded.

§15-806. Reclamation Costs.

In order to reclaim his vehicle that has been impounded, the owner shall pay towing and storage costs, plus a \$25 fee of which \$10 shall be transferred to the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation by the garage to which the vehicle was taken.

§15-807. Records of Vehicles Removed and Impounded.

The Borough Police Department shall cause a record to be kept of all vehicles impounded under this Part and shall be able at all reasonable times to furnish the owners or the agents of the owners of those vehicles with information as to the place of storage of the vehicle.

§15-808. Restrictions upon Removal of Vehicles.

No vehicle shall be removed under the authority of this Part or the Vehicle Code if, at the time of the intended removal, the owner or the person for the time being in charge of the vehicle is present and expresses a willingness and intention to remove the vehicle immediately and the vehicle does not present a hazard to traffic or the safety and welfare of drivers and pedestrians.

§15-809. Reports and Disposition of Unclaimed Vehicles.

If after a period of 15 days the vehicle in storage remains unclaimed, a report shall be filed with PennDOT in accordance with §7311 of The Vehicle Code, by the person

having legal custody of the vehicle. If the vehicle has not been claimed after 30 days, the vehicle may be transferred to a licensed salvor who will then be responsible for filing the proper reports and disposing of the vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 73 of the Pennsylvania Motor Vehicle Code (75 Pa.C.S.A. §101 *et seq.*, as amended).

Part 9

Snow and Ice Emergency

§15-901. Definitions.

Chains—full chains, straps, chains or other types of chains mounted on the driving wheels of a motorized vehicle.

Snow emergency—a snow emergency shall exist upon a snowfall accumulation of 3 inches or more or during any period in which the Borough snow plowing and snow removal equipment shall be operating on the streets and roads within the Borough; providing, however, that such periods shall not exceed more than 72 hours after the cessation of a snowfall.

Snow tires/all-purpose tires—snow tires/all-purpose tires with sufficient tread to allow self-propelled vehicles to move through streets having 3 inches or more of snow thereupon.

Vehicles—all self-propelled motorized vehicles using Borough streets and highways including taxicabs, but excluding other public transportation conveyances.

§15-902. General Provisions.

During the time of a snow emergency, as defined above, no person shall park a vehicle, or allow a vehicle to remain parked on the following streets:

§15-903. Declaration of a Snow Emergency.

A snow emergency may be declared by any two of the following: President of Borough Council, Chief of Police, Borough Manager or Superintendent of Public Works.

§15-904. Temporary No Parking.

In the event that there is an accumulation of snow and/or ice on any street causing a dangerous condition, the Police Department may post temporary “no parking” signs on any street in the Borough wherever the dangerous condition exists.

§15-905. Driving Without Snow Tires/All-Purpose Tires or Chains.

During a snow emergency, no vehicle shall be operated upon any street or road located within the Borough of Hatboro without snow-rated tires or chains.

§15-906. Towing of Vehicles.

Any vehicle parked, stalled, or incapable of moving under its own power, or left unattended upon any street or road located within the Borough, during a snow emergency, may be removed or towed away at the owner’s expense to another location at the direction of the Borough of Hatboro Police Department or other authority as authorized by the Borough Council of the Borough of Hatboro.

§15-907. Other Parking Provisions.

No provision of this Part shall be construed to permit parking on any street or at any location along said street where such parking is prohibited by the provisions of the Vehicle Code of Pennsylvania or by any other part of this Chapter or any other ordinance of the Borough of Hatboro now in effect or hereafter enacted.

§15-908. Signs.

The Superintendent of Public Works of the Borough of Hatboro is hereby authorized and directed to procure signs as may be specified by the Borough Council and to post same throughout the Borough at appropriate intervals along each street giving public notice of parking restrictions during snow alerts.

§15-909. Removal of Vehicles; Costs Recoverable.

1. In addition to any other provisions or penalties provided by this Chapter for violations hereof, should any vehicle be parked in violation of the provisions of this Part, the Chief of Police is authorized to cause such car to be removed from the street to a garage or other place of safety in the Borough or to the car owner’s property.
2. Except in the case of removal of a car to the car owner’s property, immediate

written notice of the removal of the offending car shall be given by the Chief of Police to the owner of the car as indicated by the license plate registration.

3. The owner shall reimburse the Borough for the costs of such removal and storage as shall be determined by the Chief of Police, and it shall be a violation of this Part to fail to pay such bill.

§15-910. Violations and Penalties.

1. Each police officer shall place on any vehicle parked in violation of the provisions of this Section a notice of violation, instructing the owner or operator thereof to report at the Police Headquarters of the Borough of Hatboro in regard to such violation. Each such owner or operator may, within 48 hours of the time which such notice was attached to such vehicle, pay at Police Headquarters as a penalty for and in full satisfaction of such violation, the sum of \$25. The failure of such owner or operator to make such payment at Police Headquarters within said 48 hours shall render such owner or operator subject to the penalties provided for violation of the provisions of this Section.

2. Failure to comply with the provisions of subsection .1 shall result in the issuance of a non-traffic citation listing the violations of the appropriate sections of this Part and, upon conviction thereof, the owner or operator so cited shall be guilty of a summary offense and shall pay a fine of not more than \$600 plus costs and/or undergo imprisonment up to 90 days.

Part 10**Regulation of Pedalcycles and Non-motorized Vehicles****§15-1001. Operation of Pedalcycles on Public Streets and Sidewalks.**

Operation of pedalcycles on public streets and sidewalks in the Borough shall be in accordance with the provisions of 75 Pa.C.S.A. §3501 *et seq.*

§15-1002. Restrictions on Use of Pushcarts.

1. The word “pushcart,” as used in this Section, shall mean a vehicle, including a pedalcycle, propelled solely by human power, and used or intended for use for the display, transport, exhibit, or sale of goods, wares or merchandise.

2. It shall be unlawful for any person to propel a pushcart upon any sidewalk in any business district except as necessary to move the pushcart to a location from which it is to be loaded or unloaded or from which goods, wares or merchandise are to be sold or dispensed under permit from the Borough Council as provided in subsection .3 of this Section.

3. It shall be unlawful for any person to park a pushcart upon any sidewalk except for the purpose of selling or dispensing from that pushcart goods, wares, or merchandise to passersby under permit from the Borough Council. Every such permit shall be issued to the person making application for the permit, upon payment of a fee, which shall be for the use of the Borough, set by the Borough Council pursuant to a resolution. The permit shall be granted to the applicant, upon payment of the fee, and upon his signing an agreement with the Borough Council that he shall be bound by the conditions imposed by Borough Council and made a part of the permit, dealing with the following matters:

A. Restricting or limiting the parking of the pushcart to one or more stated locations upon the sidewalk and to stated days and hours at each location.

B. Stating requirements to be adhered to in connection with the disposal of garbage and refuse resulting from the operations carried on.

C. Requiring that there be no violation of any law, ordinance, or regulation pertaining to health, sanitation, and the handling of food or drink.

§15-1003. Skates, Skateboards, Coasters, Sleds, and Other Toy Vehicles.

1. It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in sledding or riding a coaster wagon on any sidewalk or street in the Borough, except as follows:

A. A sled or a wagon may be pulled by a pedestrian with or without a rider.

B. Sledding may be permitted when a street or portion of a street has been closed to motor vehicle traffic by the Police Department for that purpose.

2. It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in roller-skating, skateboarding, or to ride upon or propel any scooter or other toy vehicle upon:

- A. Any street except in order to cross the roadway.
 - B. Any sidewalk located in a business district.
3. It shall be unlawful for any person to ride upon a motorized toy vehicle on any sidewalk in the Borough.
4. Nothing in this Part shall prevent a pedestrian from pulling a coaster, sled or other toy vehicle or from pushing a baby carriage, stroller, or wheelchair on any sidewalk. However, any such activity shall not cause a hazard to other pedestrians.

§15-1004. Violations and Penalties.

1. Any person who violates any provision of §15-1002 of this Part shall be issued a non-traffic citation and, upon conviction, shall be guilty of a summary offense and shall be ordered to pay a fine of not more than \$600 and/or undergo imprisonment for not more than 90 days.
2. Any person who violates any provision of §15-1003 of this Part shall be issued a notice of the violation. The notice of violation shall include the following information:
- A. A description of the violation of this Part for which the person is being cited.
 - B. The date and time that the notice of violation was issued.
 - C. Instructions to the violator that if the violator will immediately cease the violation, no further action will be taken. However, if the violation continues or is repeated the operator shall be directed to report to the office of the Chief of Police and pay, for the use of the Borough, a fine of \$10.
3. Any person who fails to comply with the provisions of subsection .1 shall be cited within 15 days of the violation and, upon conviction of stated violation, shall be guilty of a summary offense and may be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$10.

Part 11

Pedestrian Regulations

§15-1101. Pedestrians to Obey Traffic-Control Signs.

At all locations in the Borough where official traffic-control signals are installed, pedestrians, except where directed otherwise by pedestrian-control signals installed under §15-1102 of this Part, shall obey the directions of those traffic-control signals, as follows:

- A. When facing a green signal, a pedestrian may proceed across the roadway within a crosswalk.
- B. When facing a steady yellow signal, a pedestrian shall not start to cross the roadway.
- C. When facing a steady red signal, a pedestrian shall not enter the roadway.

§15-1102. Pedestrian-Control Signal Locations Established.

1. At the following locations, official pedestrian-control signals shall be erected (or are ratified if previously erected):

2. Every pedestrian facing a steady or flashing “Don’t Walk” signal shall obey the directions of that signal, as follows:

- A. When facing a steady “Don’t Walk” signal, a pedestrian shall not start to cross the roadway in the direction of the signal, but any pedestrian who has partially completed his crossing on the “Walk” signal should proceed to a sidewalk or safety zone while the “Don’t Walk” signal is showing.
- B. When facing a flashing “Don’t Walk” signal a pedestrian shall not start to cross the roadway in the direction of the indication, but any pedestrian who has partly completed crossing during the “Walk” indication should proceed to a sidewalk or safety zone.

Any pedestrian who fails to obey the directions of a “Don’t Walk” signal, as indicated above, shall be guilty of an offense and a violation of this Part.

§15-1103. Locations Where Pedestrian Crossing in Unmarked Crosswalks Restricted.

Except when authorized by a police officer or other appropriately attired person authorized to direct, control or regulate traffic, it shall be unlawful for any pedestrian to cross the roadway at any of the following streets, at the intersection with that street indicated.

§15-1104. Locations Where Pedestrians May Cross Only in Crosswalk.

1. It shall be unlawful for any pedestrian:

A. To cross any roadway in a business district within the Borough except in a crosswalk.

B. To cross the roadway, in any of the following portions of streets in the Borough, except in a crosswalk:

2. Nothing in this Section shall permit any pedestrian to cross in a crosswalk at any location where that crossing is prohibited by §15-1102 of this Part.

§15-1105. Violations and Penalties.

When a violation of this Part occurs and said violation is not a violation of the Vehicle Code, the prosecution shall be brought under the appropriate section of this Part and, upon conviction thereof, the violator shall be guilty of a summary offense and may be sentenced to pay a fine of \$25 for the first offense, and a fine not to exceed \$600 for subsequent convictions and/or undergo imprisonment not to exceed 90 days.
